About the Course: 2024 CPT Training Requirements



Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 109.803, the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission (OPOTC) is required to set a minimum number of hours for continued professional training (CPT) if there is supporting funding. The Ohio General Assembly has once again provided funding for CPT hours in

2024. The OPOTC Commission has established the following distribution of

the 24 hours.

8 Hours – "Five mandatory topics", totaling 8 hours set by the Commission that all peace officers and troopers must take in 2024 are:

2 hours	Legal Updates
2 hours	Crisis De-Escalation

l hour	Marsy's Law/Victims Rights
