Latent print identification and lifting, tool marks, chemical fuming, preservation of collected latent, tool and pry marks

Other Information for the course



Students should bring their department SLR camera or at least a digital camera with a manual mode. A tripod and external flash should be brought as well.

Bring a flashlight, a box of nitrile gloves and any current evidence tech kit that your techs have been issued.

The course price includes a basic tech kit with items hand-picked by the instructors.

This course is comparable to the OPOTA 2 week ET I and ET II combined course with more personalized instruction.

Since then Tanya has worked in the capacity of field patrol officer, evidence technician, field training officer, Crash team member, Community relations officer, SRO and Patrol Sergeant. She has been qualified as an expert witness in crime scene photography and has instructed hundreds of Ohio Peace Officers in photography and evidence collection. She has been an instructor for NCPI since 2005.

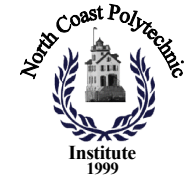
