Continuing Professional Training under SB #281

In 2008, the OPOTC has required that six (6) hours of training be provided to all Ohio peace officers to comply with the mandatory Continuing Professional Training (CPT) requirements under Senate Bill 281. This seminar should comply with all of the requirements for Continuing Professional Training certification.

The first two (2) hours will be dedicated to Victims of Crime related training as recommended by the OPOTC. Three (3) hours will be dedicated to constitutional case review from the United States Supreme Court and the Ohio Supreme Court related to Miranda with emphasis upon the 5th Amendment Right to Silence and the 6th Amendment Right to Counsel. The final three (3) hours will be dedicated to Civil Liability issues with emphasis on Use of Deadly and Non-Deadly force, Motor Vehicle related incidents and False Arrest/Illegal Searches.
