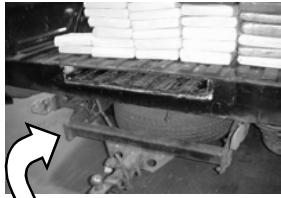

This seminar is designed for officers who have responsibility to enforce traffic laws or narcotics officers who want to learn how to find contraband in concealed compartments in motor vehicles. Across this nation, highly trained criminal patrol interdiction officers are seizing tons of narcotics and millions of dollars from traffic stops of motorists. The term “looking beyond the traffic stop” is synonymous with effective criminal interdiction officers. Many of these seizures involve smuggling of the contraband in concealed compartments in motor vehicles. Some of these concealment methods are highly sophisticated utilizing electronic or hydraulic compartments. During the seminar, officers will be

instructed on the latest concealment methods. Topics to be discussed will include common indicators of concealed compartments, types and locations of compartments, developing systematic techniques in locating the compartments, and methods used to open the compartments. Training will be provided utilizing lecture presentations, videos of various compartments and hundreds of slides and photos depicting many actual seizures and different concealment techniques.

About the instructor:



Mr. William D. Healy was a career law enforcement officer for the past 29 years. He retired from the Ohio State Highway Patrol after 24 years of service. He was the coordinator of the Patrol's Traffic Drug Interdiction Teams (TDIT). Mr. Healy has taught drug interdiction/criminal patrol enforcement throughout Ohio and the United States for the Drug Enforcement Administration, the Narcotics Association of Regional Coordinating Officers (NARCO) and the Drug Interdiction Assistance Program (DIAP). He is also a former adjunct professor of constitutional law at Ohio University. He is the Director of the Northcoast Polytechnic Institute (NPI) in Lorain County.

Mr. Terry Helton is a seventeen (17) year veteran of Ohio State Highway Patrol. For the past ten (10) years he has been assigned to the Criminal Patrol/Drug Interdiction Unit where he has served as an interdiction trooper, canine handler and supervisor. Currently Terry is a Sergeant assigned to supervisory duties with the Highway Patrol in charge of Criminal Patrol/Drug Interdiction activities throughout Northeast Ohio.
