Continuing Professional Training under SB #281

In 2008, the OPOTC has required that six (6) hours of training be provided to all Ohio peace officers to comply with the mandatory Continuing Professional Training (CPT) requirements under Senate Bill 281. This seminar should comply with all of the requirements for Continuing Professional Training certification.

The first two (2) hours will be dedicated to Victims of Crime related training as recommended by the OPOTC. The remaining six (6) hours will be dedicated to Search & Seizure issues. The Victims of Crime training will include a review of lesson plans developed by OPOTA: Death Notifications and Bridging the Gap. The Search & Seizure training will discuss the 4th Amendment and why law enforcement officers stop people. In addition, the seven major exceptions to the search warrant rule will be discussed with emphasis on stop & frisk, search incident to arrest, probable cause, plain view, plain feel, inventory and consent. The Search & Seizure review will include a thorough review of case decisions rendered by the Ohio Supreme Court and the United States Supreme Court.

About the instructor:



Mr. William Healy was a career law enforcement officer for over 29 years. He retired from the Ohio Highway Patrol after serving for 25 years. While on the Patrol, he served for 5 years as a manager/instructor at the Highway Patrol Academy. Mr. Healy has a Bachelor's Degree from Ohio University and a Master's Degree from Central Michigan University in General Administration. He currently serves as the Director of North Coast Polytechnic Institute. Mr. Healy is a graduate of the Southern Police Institute's Administrative Officer's Course at the University of Louisville. He has served as an instructor at the Northwestern University Traffic Institute (NUTI), the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP), the Ohio Attorney General's Conference on Law Enforcement, the Drug Enforcement Administration, and the Drug Interdiction Assistance Program. He is a life-time certified instructor with the Ohio Peace Officer's Training Council (OPOTC).
