## About the instructor:



*Law enforcement officials are involved in numerous ethical dilemmas. . .*

Across the United States, law enforcement agencies and officers have been involved in numerous ethical dilemmas that has created a lack of trust on the part of the public, news media and other members of the criminal justice system. From the Rodney King incident to law enforcement officers convicted of criminal offenses, the law enforcement community has suffered from a lack of ethical core values. This seminar is designed to provide an ethical framework by which law enforcement officers and criminal justice agencies can evaluate their decision making and choices in potential ethical dilemmas.



**Mr. William D. Healy** was a career law enforcement officer for over 29 years. He retired from the Ohio State Highway Patrol after 25 years of service. Mr. Healy was a Staff Lieutenant in charge of the Highway Patrol's Traffic Drug Interdiction Team (TDIT). He also served as a Lieutenant in charge of the Highway Patrol training programs at the Ohio State Highway Patrol Academy. Mr. Healy retired from the State Patrol in January 1999. He has a Bachelor's degree from Ohio University and a Master's degree from Central Michigan University in General Administration. Mr. Healy is a graduate of the Southern Police Institute's Administrative Officers Course at the University of Louisville. He has served as an instructor for the Southern Police Institute (SPI), Northwestern University Traffic Institute (NUTI), the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP), the Drug Enforcement Administration and the Drug Interdiction Assistance Program. Mr. Healy currently serves as the Director of Training for the North Coast Polytechnic Institute which is a privately owned criminal justice and law enforcement training company in Grafton, Ohio.
