About the course:



“Tactical Submachine Gun Instructor School”

The Tactical Submachine Gun Instructor course is directed to those officers needing training or wanting to instruct the submachine gun. Instruction focuses on intensive tactical shooting drills, firearms safety, submachine gun administrative procedure and submachine gun operational procedure. The course provides students with a practical knowledge of the submachine gun, instructional capability and shooting proficiency.

NOTE: Successful completion of the course satisfies one of the OPOTC requirements for assault rifle-carbine instructor certification

About the instructors:

Mr. Matthew Balli

Mr. Matthew Balli is a career law enforcement officer who has been a member of the law enforcement community for almost 15 years. Currently, Mr. Balli is a Sergeant and assigned as a first line supervisor for the East Cleveland Police Department. Mr. Balli is a firearms expert who has been certified by the Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy as a trainer-of-trainers in numerous firearms specialties to include semi-auto pistol, revolver, shotgun, tactical assault rifle, sub-gun and precision (scoped) rifle. Mr. Balli has served as a instructor for OPOTA on numerous occasions at their London and Richfield facilities.

About the requirements



Course requirements include:

- 1 Students must attend and participate in all training sessions.
- 2 Students must observe and practice all firearms and range safety rules during all training sessions.
- 3 Students must complete a final written examination scoring no less than 80%.
- 4 Students must successfully complete an administrative procedure evaluation.
- 5 Students must successfully complete an operational procedure evaluation.
- 6 Students must successfully complete evaluation phases for satisfactory completion of the course.
- 7 Students having difficulty with one or more of the evaluation phases may request a second evaluation.

NOTE: Extended training hours are required. Also, numerous special equipment items are required and a list will be supplied upon course application.
