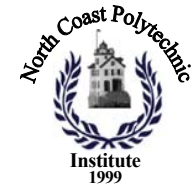

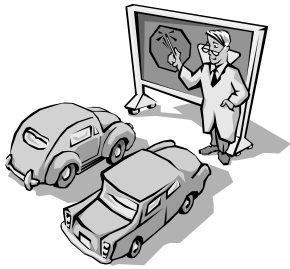

Traffic Law Update & Laws of Arrest Issues



*... must
be aware of changes*

During 2004, numerous changes to Ohio's traffic laws went into effect through legislation enacted by the Ohio Legislature. Over the past several years, additional changes and revisions have been made to traffic laws. These changes affected law enforcement operations and enforcement efforts. This training is designed to provide information to law enforcement officers concerning traffic law and arrest issues. A thorough review of the new laws enacted by the Legislature will be conducted. In addition, a review of OVI laws and standardized field sobriety testing related to substantive or strict compliance will be provided. Finally, **laws of arrest issues** related to Ohio Revised Code Chapter 2935 and court appellate decisions will be provided. Law enforcement officers who have the authority to enforce Ohio's laws must be aware of statutory changes affecting their daily operations.
